We have been shortlisted in the environmental category in the BBC Make a Difference Awards. The awards are to celebrate people who are going above and beyond and making a difference to where they live. The environmental category celebrates those who help to make where they live more environmentally friendly.

### Language of the half term

Did you know that 32 languages are spoken in our school? Each half term we celebrate and learn about a different language and this half term we are celebrating Romanian. The children will learn how to speak words and phrases in Romanian and explore Romanian culture. Kathy our cook will also be introducing the children to some Romanian dishes.

### Attendance

The last two of years have been difficult for children as the pandemic has limited attendance for many. We know that there is a clear link between high attendance and good progress in learning. Children need to attend school regularly to benefit from their education. Missing out on lessons leaves children vulnerable to falling behind.

Attendance is going to be a big focus for us this year. We will be bringing back rewards and incentives to promote good attendance and will be working closely with our Education Welfare Officer, Helen Carolina to track attendance and provide more regular updates. We are aiming for an attendance figure of 96% for all children - this means no more than 8 days off school in the year.

We do understand that it can be tricky at times, and that children may struggle to attend school for a wide range of reasons. Do get in touch if you need support. We want to work with you to put the right support in place so that every child achieves their potential.

### Term-time holidays

The Government has renewed appeals to parents not to take their children out of school during term time. We support this and children will only be given permission to take leave in term time if there are exceptional circumstances. Any leave of absence must be applied for **before** your child will be absent.
