A Private School Fund is described as any funds (other than those of the Council) which exist for the purposes of a school and are established under the authority of the Governors of a school. It is generally used for collecting money towards, and paying for things like educational visits, clubs, fundraising activities, school photographs, and similar.

Hollinswood Primary School & Nursery's Private School Fund is reviewed annually by an auditor and the audited accounts are presented to Governors at least once a year. The latest audited accounts are dated 31/03/2023.






We're now working on a new Plastic Clever Schools award. Join us at home to reduce single use plastics!


The ocean helps us breathe

At Hollinswood Primary School our school values (4Rs) are being responsible, resourceful, respectful, and resilient. During the SATs our Year 6 pupils demonstrated all 4Rs. We were so proud to see them embrace the challenge and persevere. We were impressed with their resilience in facing tricky questions; their resourcefulness in working hard to remember things that they have been taught; the respectful way that they conducted themselves in the papers and after them; and finally how they have taken responsibility for their revision and practice. They may not realise it, but they have developed lots of skills as learners that will help them as they move into secondary school.

It is not statutory for teachers to provide teacher assessments at the end of KS2 because the SATs results are used; however, at Hollinswood, we feel strongly that SATs papers only give a snapshot of a pupil's ability and not necessarily an accurate one; therefore, we will continue to share our teacher assessments with every child's secondary school. We believe the child's progress and ability is more accurately captured in what they do on a day-to-day basis....not what they can do in an hour.

Thank you to all Year 6 parents/carers for all your support and as a community we can all be proud of the values our Year 6 pupils demonstrate.
